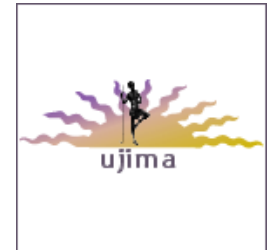




UjimaSuites SchoolMe Ujima Consultants 2003



A School Supplemental Support Management System

This application is used to record, maintain and manage student support information that compliments but does not duplicate school academic tracking. **SchoolMe** tracks the student environment attributes as statistics factors and provides reports and graphs regarding service frequency. The **SchoolMe** application is used to provide student assessment, parent involvement and cooperative service efforts for student care in school facilities, training service reports and parent or student contract agreement.

The application allows multiple school activity categories, which can be editing rather serving individual student or class or group bases. Student concerns and parent volunteer commitments can be maintained. Details can be created and tracked on multiple student data elements. Schools can edited most of the drop-down menu and selection list to personalize **SchoolMe** to their school environment.

In-Take Screen Tabs

The client entry screen changes to allow for tabs that provide faster access for user. The Intake screen tabs allow for **SchoolMe** to have several quick student usage reports and generate a standard contract. There is also a tab to record student meal requirements. This Intake screen also allows the school or agency to make a clickable count of the services received by the client.

Student Services Grouping

The **SchoolMe** application allows the user school or agency to maintain quality information on special care class activities. All students or trainees in a particular class or group function can be treated as a group for recording service activities. Staff or instructor tasks can be recorded against activities for billing purposes. There is also a dedicated grouping for parent volunteer or staff activities.

Hot Meals services

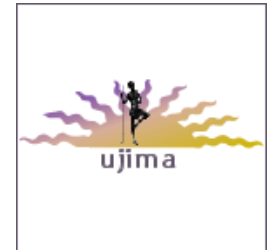
The Hot Meals Module is used to collect, track and edit data into reports for school facilities or training providers that served on-site meals to students or trainees. The application has individual setup for special meals, along with food type estimating and meal tracking. Meal tracking can be by breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks. Food items can be setup to estimate USFDA daily requirements or use some other standard.

Administration and Reports

Staff tasks can be recorded against activities for billing purposes. System Administrator can make global category changes and control user access at different levels. Access for printing can be limited and various client-warning notices can be set. Staff job reports can be compiled for management. This application offers multiple users reporting and executive graphs. Application can be accessed over a network or from a remote site. The database functionality is compatible with NetMeeting capabilities.

UjimaSuites Version Integration

SchoolMe application integrates with other **UjimaSuites** packages such as the **Case Management** application for registering clients and taking history and medical background. The application can also be used with the **Children-In-Crisis (CIC)** database for documenting necessary infant/youth mandated foster care.

UjimaSuites Support

The **FORUM** member agencies and professional practitioners have reviewed the **SchoolMe** revised application. They help to provide some of the distribution task requirements and sample data. The sample data is based on specific evaluation usage of the application as an internal client interview questionnaire and ongoing tracking needs. All names have been changed to protect client confidentiality.

SchoolMe is a **Ujima Consultants** copyright application available as a CD release. **SchoolMe** is recommended for organization needing to track client personal care service activities for multiple guardians and funding sources. **SchoolMe** can be used for schools or organizations with trainees or clients and need to track information in addition to the academic or training requirements. Such sites might include JTPA centers or 501(c) organizations, daycare or home-care service providers and facilities.
